For the metrics, faculty counts for both Social Work and Tri-Campus (Waterbury) include Robert Fisher, located at Tri-Campus and 75% teaching at Tri-Campus but tenured and teaching one course in Social Work; for other University summaries of faculty, Fisher is counted at Waterbury only.

Because the metrics and the student faculty ratio are calculated from regular payroll faculty and adjunct lecturer headcounts, the following part-time regular faculty members, who may contribute to the various metrics, are omitted: Fall 2002 and Fall 2003 - Eleanor Lyon, 50% employed; Fall 2003, Fall 2004, Fall 2005, and Fall 2006 - Harriett Johnson, 70% employed; and Fall 2006 and Fall 2007 - Peter Papallo, 50% employed. The Dean of the academic unit also is excluded from all faculty counts for the metrics.
